

“mini laminate chip directions”

Supply List



Supplies:

- 5 ½" length of Ball Chain with one connector
- 6 Laminate Chips
- 12 precut pieces of printed paper
- 2 Lengths of ribbon (2 colors)
- 6 Heidi Swapp Small Pink Flower Jewels
- Assorted Rubons
- Assorted Diecuts

Consumable Supplies Needed:

- ModPodge Matte Finish
- Foam Brush
- Dark Brown or Chestnut Roan ColorBox Fluid Chalk Ink
- Judikins Diamond Glaze
- Scrapbook Adhesives by 3L EZ Runner
- Sand Paper

General Directions:

Step ONE:

Sand the smooth side of each chip to be used. Wipe off any dust.

Step TWO:

Apply a thin coat of ModPodge with a foam brush to the sanded side of chip one and place patterned paper piece over the chip to cover it completely.

Step THREE:

After the ModPodge has dried completely, trim the edges with a craft knife.

Step FOUR:

Punch a hole in the top of the chip using the prepunched hole visible on the backside of the chip as a guide. An “Anywhere Hole Punch” works well for this task (found in the Making Memories Toolkit to create the hole for eyelets). A Crop-a-Dile also works great for this, and I would suggest using it over the Anywhere Punch if possible.

Step FIVE:

Once your hole has been punched, use a craft knife to clean out the hole so that the entire hole is open and flush with the edges of the preexisting hole.

Step SIX:

Ink all the edges of your trimmed chip with ColorBox Fluid Chalk Ink in either Chestnut Roan or Dark Brown.

Step SEVEN:

Embellish with the remaining pieces in the kit for that particular chip. I'd suggest adhering the jewels with JudiKins Diamond Glaze, and the diecuts with an EZ Runner.

Step EIGHT:

Repeat steps TWO-SEVEN for the remaining chips.

Step NINE:

Repeat steps TWO-SIX for the backside of each of the remaining chips.

Step TEN:

After the embellishments have all dried and you have completed each chip as desired, you need to seal them to protect them from the elements. To do this apply a coat of ModPodge to the front of each chip. Applying it over photos will not be a problem and it will dry clear. Repeat this on the backside of each chip after the front has dried. For good measure I would suggest repeating this process up to three more times.

Step ELEVEN:

String your chips together using the provided ball chain. Tie pieces of ribbon around the chain as desired.
